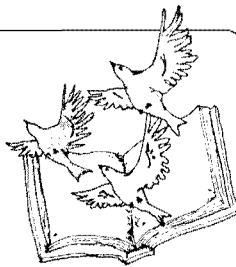

Please feel free to make more requests in the future. Due to the amount of requests we receive every week, we are only able to send books to you every 2 months. Be sure to send your requests accordingly.

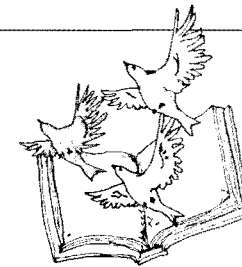
